THE WORD THIS WEEK

Shepherds, good and bad, provide the obvious link between the First Reading, Psalm and Gospel today. The penalty for being a bad shepherd, Doom, is hinted at but not specified in the First Reading, which issues heavy threats that the Lord will 'take care of you for your misdeeds.' In a pastoral society being a bad shepherd is the ultimate crime, and though in Jeremiah's time the people were settled rather than nomadic, as in Abraham's time, sheep and shepherds were still familiar (though humbler in status, like the shepherds at Jesus's birth). King David, alluded to by Jeremiah, had been a shepherd and is reputed to have been the author of psalms. Few are more appropriately attributed to him than today's, although authorship is impossible to establish. These days the images of Pastor and Shepherd are still applied to the leaders of the Church, and the same harsh judgement applies to bad 'shepherds' as before; clergy who have led people astray have caused enormous havoc. Jesus in the Gospel today took pity on the crowds as they were like sheep without a shepherd. Note how the flock is formed - the people had come 'from every town' and hurried to see Jesus, seeing him as a potential shepherd. He cannot escape from his responsibility, although he had hoped to be by himself with his disciples 'in a lonely place.' Sheep must be shepherded, if they are not to be the prey of wolves.
